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Research

For the first and second quarters of 2018 (January – June), our focus was to implement the youth survey in schools in Piscataquis County, Maine, along with a school in Jackman (a community with ties to schools in Piscataquis County). Parental permission to participate in the survey was required.

- An additional one-year grant from the University of Maine Research Reinvestment Fund was awarded for an undergraduate research assistant.
- Angelina Buzzelli, a Marketing major in the Maine Business School and a graduate of a Piscataquis County High School, was hired for this role.
- IRB approval was granted for the survey with Steering Committee comments and suggestions incorporated.
- Dawna, Nicole, and Angelina worked together to contact officials at all schools involved to solicit their participation in the survey project and to discuss the distribution of permission letters.
- Second and third round of permission letters were printed and distributed to schools.

- Flyers were posted throughout Piscataquis County and Jackman informing people about the listening sessions and survey.
- Surveys were delivered electronically to schools and completed by 205 students.
- Listening sessions were held in Dover-Foxcroft on May 21, 2018 and in Greenville on May 22, 2018.
- The project team held monthly conference calls.

Outreach

- In conjunction with the Rural Aspirations Project, the University of Maine held a *Winter Summit* on January 11-12, 2018. The summit brought teachers to campus to investigate post-secondary and rural school landscapes in preparation for establishing a Maine Forest Collaborative.
- Collaborations were established with Helping Hands with Heart and the Piscataquis Chamber of Commerce.
- Angelina presented "Rural Youth Futures: Preliminary Research" at the annual University of Maine Student Research Symposium in Bangor, ME, April 17, 2018.
- The Rural Youth Aspirations Project and The University of Maine held a *Spring Summit* May 17-18, 2018. The summit brought teachers to campus to gain a deeper understanding of innovations within Maine's natural resource economy and select a guiding question for the first year of the Maine Forest Collaborative.
